



## ALL CREATURES – GREAT OR SMALL

### CHALLENGE 2012

#### Rules

The theme is “All Creatures – Great or Small”. Your quilt must include at least one creature, great or small. Also, your quilt must include various techniques including appliqué (hand or machine), paper piecing, strip piecing and some creative stitching (hand or machine). You have the choice of making a wallhanging to keep or a wheelchair quilt to donate to Community Projects. The four challenge fabrics must be noticeable on the front of the wallhanging or wheelchair quilt. The quilts must be bound.

The finished product is due by 9 PM April 10, 2012 guild meeting.

Voting will take place at the May 8, 2012 guild meeting.

**Quilt Show:** The challenge quilts will go directly to the Quilt Show after the May 8 meeting and form part of the Challenge exhibit.

**If making a wallhanging,** the circumference must not exceed 200”. Embellishments may be used. A 4” sleeve must be attached to the back as well as a label.

**If making a wheelchair quilt,** the circumference must not exceed 126”. Embellishments may be used but bear in mind that the wheelchair quilts are apt to be washed frequently & in hot water.

No sleeve is required. Pin a paper with your name on the back of the quilt. Add a Guild label if you have one. Otherwise, a Guild label will be attached after judging. See reverse or CTQG web site for specs on wheelchair quilts.

Wallhanging category:

First: \$50.

Second: \$40.

Wheelchair quilt category:

First: \$50.

Second: \$40.

2 Consolation Prizes: \$10. each.



## **Wheelchair Quilt**

The easiest way to make the wheelchair quilt is to make a rectangle, then cut off the bottom two corners. When planning your design, keep in mind that those two bottom corners need to look balanced, not lopped off.

**SIZE:** Make your rectangle 30" - 32" wide by 33" - 35" long.

Measure and make a mark from the bottom right corner 7" along the bottom of the quilt and 7" up the right side. Lay your ruler across those marks and cut the corner away.

Repeat for the left corner.

Layer, quilt and bind your quilt as usual, adding a Guild label if you have one. The label can also be added after the quilt is finished.
